2010 International EFAM Scholarship Application

The San Diego Chapter of IAAP is offering a scholarship to attend the 2010 IAAP International Convention in Boston, Massachusetts, July 18-21, Hynes Convention Center. The Chapter's Board of Directors feels that attendance at this event would be an outstanding educational and motivational opportunity for a member to progress into and enhance their leadership roles of the chapter.

To qualify for this scholarship you must meet the established criteria and complete the application (available on the website). A panel of judges will consider all applications and recommend a winner to

the Chapter's Board of Directors, who will make the final decision. The Chapter will award the winner up to \$2,000 to attend the conference.

Criteria:

- Applicant must be a San Diego member in good standing
- Applicant must regularly attend chapter functions
- Applicant must have a desire to progress into leadership roles in the Chapter

Deadline for scholarship application is **Monday, March 15, 2010.**

Board of Directors Duties

Corresponding Secretary: Tessa Wright

The Bylaws say that the Corresponding Secretary shall:

1. Give notice of all Board meetings as directed by the President;
2. Conduct the correspondence of the Chapter in accordance with the direction of the President and/or the Board of Directors, to include:
 - a) maintenance of the Chapter roster and directory (Chair Roster Committee),
 - b) publicizing the activities of the Chapter (Chair Publicity Committee), and
 - c) Obtaining and disseminating information on administrative employment opportunities (Chair Employment Committee);
3. Perform such other duties as may be assigned by the Board of Directors or the Chapter - or those that I volunteer for such as the Networking activities at dinner meetings.

Corresponding Secretary actually:

1. Spends about 15-20 minutes total during the month sending information on upcoming dinner meetings and other events and publicizing them -I send three or four email reminders monthly for each dinner meeting and then three or four for each special event;
2. Spends about five minutes a day corresponding with other Board members via email on various issues in the normal course of business;
3. Updates the roster and directory periodically when new members join or there are changes in membership; this takes about 10 minutes total for each update because I have to change an email contact listing and two data base files;
4. Sends maybe two or three emails a month regarding employment opportunities that take about two minutes to compose and send attends dinner and Board meetings each month so that takes two evenings from 5:30 to 7:30 or 8:00; and
5. Spends anywhere from 15-30 minutes on special tasks that I have volunteered for such as the networking activity and Board position flyer!

Treasurer: Lori Poore CAP

The Bylaws say that the Treasurer shall:

1. Have custody of all Chapter funds, making disbursements only as authorized by the Chapter, either by specific action or by adoption of a budget.
2. Pay all approved bills promptly by check upon receipt of a voucher countersigned by the President or President-Elect.
3. Chair the Retirement Trust Foundation and Budget Committees.
4. Keep the financial records current and make a monthly report to the Chapter.
5. Prepare the Chapter's annual tax form(s).

(For a complete list of duties, see Chapter Bylaws.)

What This Means:

The Treasurer spends about 5-6 hours per month doing the following:

1. Attends Chapter meetings and monthly Board meetings.
2. Deposits checks received for dinner meetings or other events.
3. Prepares revenue vouchers for all deposits received and expense vouchers for all checks disbursed.
4. Keeps track of money received and spent and compares to budget.
5. Picks up mail at the Chapter's post office box in Mission Valley approximately once a week.
6. Chairs the Retirement Trust Foundation Committee and plans fundraising events.
7. Completes Chapter's tax return (Form 990EZ) from information prepared by previous year's Treasurer.
